Join a June 12th discussion about the dockless bike and scooter program, including the opportunities and challenges these new options raise for older adults and their safety. Learn more about the DDOT pilot program and contribute to problem-solving related to program oversight.

Unlike Capital Bikeshare bikes, these new “players” in our multimodal urban space do not have fixed homes (company docking stations) to which they must be locked.

Capitol Hill Village members Mike Grace and James Kennedy will be joined on a panel by a DDOT representative who works on the dockless bike pilot program and participates in the Age Friendly DC transportation committee.

DDOT has extended this pilot or trial program to the end of August. Our Transportation Department will benefit from hearing the ideas and opinions of older adults before making decisions about the number of bikes and scooters as well as the rules bike companies are expected to follow.
